

Embassy Conducts Orientation for Japan-Africa Youth Programme Participants at Greek Community School

On 13 August, the Embassy conducted an orientation session at the Greek Community School for secondary school students participating in the Japan-Africa Youth Program. During the session, Embassy staff provided an overview of Japanese culture and Japan-Africa relations and responded to questions from the students regarding Japanese culture and etiquette.

The Africa Youth Program is an international exchange initiative implemented in collaboration with the African Union Commission (AUC), with support from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan. The program aims to promote mutual understanding between the next generation of youth in Japan and Africa. At the Ninth Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD9), held in August last year, Japan expressed its commitment to accelerating efforts in human resource development and exchange with a focus on youth and women. This program represents the concrete realization of that commitment.

23 high school students aged 15 to 18 from the Greek Community School will visit Japan from 24 August to 2 September. During their stay, they will visit a secondary school in Nara Prefecture, tour Japanese companies, and participate in homestays.
